

Message from our Interim Moderator

A NEW THING FROM GOD SPRINGS UP

'The Quiet Revival' is a survey commissioned by the Bible Society and conducted by YouGov in England and Wales. It is believed the results of this survey would be similar in Scotland. Key findings are as follows:

- From 2018-2024 the number of 18-24-year-olds attending church at least monthly rose from 4% to 16% (the figures for young men have gone from 4%-21%)
- Men (13%) are more likely to attend church than women (10%) reversing a standard view
- 19% of churchgoers are from an ethnic minority
- Nearly 50% of young Black people aged 18-34 attend church at least monthly
- Overall churchgoing population has increased from 8%-12% (2018-24 ie from 3.7m-5.8m)
- Some publishers report an 87% increase in bible sales from 2019-24

God is moving by His Spirit in the life of the UK, and this should give us hope. Parts of the church are in decline but there is measure of renewal happening at the same time, as God reforms his church and brings fresh growth and life.

We give thanks for those who have kept the flame burning and been faithful to what they have known. We are now to bend over backwards to accommodate younger generations who are seeking the truth, that they might find the Lord in contexts that are relevant to them. Christians of many years standing can be like mothers and fathers to the upcoming generations – preparing to pass on knowledge and experience.

'Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up, do you not perceive it?' (Isaiah 43:18-19)

All this should encourage us to pray with fresh hope and fervour. Our speech, which is the overflow of our heart, can declare God's truth and promises. We can work with God, listening for

His still small voice. We frame the future with God for surely he will have a Bride fit for His Son.

All financial and fabric matters have reverted back to the responsibility of the Kirk Session. Our elder will be trustees; Congregational Board members are no longer charity trustees.

We would like to thank all members who have served diligently on the board over many years. Particularly Betty Arbuckle, Sadie Barr, Robert Humphries and May Livingstone for their exceptionally long service as board members, Rita McKenna for her long service as Clerk to the Board and Una McGhie for serving as minute secretary these last 5 years. The Church of Scotland have acknowledged their long service, with certificates signed by the moderator; they were presented with them on Sunday 31 August.


REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY



CHURCH FINANCE

May I remind readers that our financial position in 2025 is being affected by two matters which are outwith our control. Firstly, our contributions to the Central Church and to Presbytery have increased by over 50% following the General Assembly's decision to change the basis of calculating what churches should pay. We have raised this issue with Presbytery but they have confirmed that they are not in a position to help as the issue has arisen as a result of a General Assembly decision which they are required to follow.

The second point affecting our financial position is that fact that in previous years we benefitted from an extremely generous donation from an anonymous donor. This source of income ended towards the end of 2024 hence affecting all of the finances of 2025 and beyond.

In addition to these two points, I note that general weekly income is lower than in previous years due I think to smaller attendances at morning worship. We should all remain grateful for the donations made but with an ageing membership there is perhaps an inevitability that it becomes harder and harder to keep income up to the very high standards experienced in Bridgeton in years gone by.

I have completed the accounts for the current year up to the end of July. This shows that there was a loss in the general account in the first seven months of the year of about £8,000. This is very much in line with what was anticipated at the beginning of the year.

Everyone should be aware that we have plenty of money in the bank to cover any expected losses for the whole year and beyond barring, of course, something totally unpredicted happening. Let us all hope and pray that nothing arises.

Firmly rooted in the affairs of the Kirk, it covered a broad range of subjects from international affairs and British political and social issues to science, ethics, and the arts, offering a forum for views on current social and moral issues; a monthly meditation; articles on the spiritual side of life; reviews of Christian resources; and features on the Church.

At the General Assembly in May 2025, the Church made the decision to end the publication of the magazine.

The final edition is available for free on the Church of Scotland website. If you had a subscription to Life & Work you will receive a refund in due course.
